Here's what's in this Release (October 25th, 2023)

In this second phase of anatomical sites changes, we've completed changes to the Subjective and Radiating body models and made changes to the areas of the back in the Care Plan Wizard Tree View, and the SOAP Note screen Plan section's "Body Areas" button Tree View. Enhanced Care Plan Tree View: With this update, you can now see the more specific Back Body Sites within the Care Plan Wizard's Procedures Body Tree View. This will reduce the chance of redundancy and allow for more accuracy of your care plans and subsequent SOAP Notes.

Enhanced Care Plan Narrative: With the enhancement of Back Body Sites, the Care Plan Narrative has been updated accordingly.



Enhanced Plan Section Back Body Tree View: The Body Tree View in the SOAP Note Plan section has been updated to provide a more detailed and accurate representation of the back body sites and is now identical to the anatomical sites in the Care Plan Wizard. Providers can now easily pinpoint and document specific regions of the patient's back, including laterality, ensuring a more comprehensive and detailed SOAP Note Narrative.

SOAP Note Narrative: The enhanced Back Body Sites have been seamlessly integrated into the SOAP Note Narrative.



Terminology Update: We have renamed "Pelvis (on Anterior and Posterior)" of the Subjective and Radiating body models to "L and R Hip (on Anterior and Posterior)." This change to more general, layman's terms for patients ease of use especially with regards to our Patient Kiosk.
